## **Calendar Information and Timelines**

**Mason City High School Vocal Music:** Concert Choir WorldStrides Trip postponed, no future date set at this time. More information will be shared as it becomes available.

**MCHS Prom and Post Prom:** On Wednesday (3-17-2020), [Governor Reynolds issued a State of Public Health Disaster Emergency](#). In this, Governor Reynolds proclaimed the following:

A. Restaurants and Bars: All Restaurants and Bars are hereby closed to the general public except that to the extent permitted by applicable law, and in accordance with any recommendations of the Iowa Department of Public Health, food and beverages may be sold if such food or beverages are promptly taken from the premises, such as on a carry-out or drive-through basis, or if the food or beverage is delivered to customers off the premises.

E. Mass Gathering: Social, community, spiritual, religious, recreational, leisure, and sporting gatherings and events of more than 10 people are hereby prohibited at all locations and venues, including but not limited to parades, festivals, conventions, and fundraisers. **Planned large gatherings and events must be canceled or postponed until after the termination of this disaster.**

Based upon this proclamation, and a result of conversations and support from Newman Catholic Schools, the Prom Advisor, and the After Prom Committee, we are recommending the postponement of Prom,

currently scheduled on April 25. We will continue to abide by and adhere to future guidance from our Governor and Legislature before making any official decisions regarding the future date of Prom. We will make every effort to have Prom. We appreciate your understanding and flexibility during this difficult time.

### **Miscellaneous Other**

**Student Learning Educational Opportunities:** The mission of the Mason City Community School District is to provide a quality education for all in a caring and responsive environment. With that in mind, many staff members have been reaching out to connect with the students they serve. This quick response has also resulted in unintended consequences that may be confusing for students and families.

As a district, we offer the following guidance.

- The health and safety of our students and their families is our primary consideration.
- Any communication that will impact the district students, families and staff will come from the district office.
- This is a very stressful time for our students and families. We do not want to add additional stress to anyone.
- Any communication from teachers that offers educational opportunities will not impact a student's grade, credit or opportunity for graduation. Participating in these opportunities is completely optional for students. The intent is to provide an opportunity for learning that is universal, accessible and optional; not a requirement.
- The district leaders and building principals will be working on a plan for our return to school on April 13, 2020. Further information will be shared as it becomes available.

This guidance will be in place through April 10, 2020. We want you to know that we are here to help you in any way that we can. Please feel free to reach out to us with any further questions. Take care of yourself and your families!



Remember, to help prevent the spread of respiratory diseases, the CDC recommends the following actions:

- Frequently wash your hands for 20 seconds or more with soapy water. If unavailable, use hand sanitizer.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
